Region	Shell Colour	Shell Shape
South Australia		
Coffin Bay	Very clean shells. Light in colour	Regular. Noticeable Depth
Smoky Bay	Purple Grey with ripples present in shell	Tends to have a pronounced frill
Streaky Bay	Even grey black colour	Regular shell shape that is noticeably elongated
Denial Bay	Typical Grey Hue	Large and uniform Oyster shape

St Helens	Light Colour	Rounded with a distinctive frill

Region	Meat Colour	Taste
South Australia		
Coffin Bay	White colour. Very full with light coloured mantle	Sweet with a salty finish
Smoky Bay	Flesh is very creamy white with black mantle	Premium oyster. A saltiness that contrast with sweet aftertaste
Streaky Bay	Tends to be a darker colour that is still creamy	Very soft mouth fill and a sweet finish
Denial Bay	Meat tends to be a rich creamy white and is a plump juicy oyster	Thick and crispy in taste with briny overtones

St Helens	Meat is plump and white	A sweet less salty taste
